CLUB STATEMENT

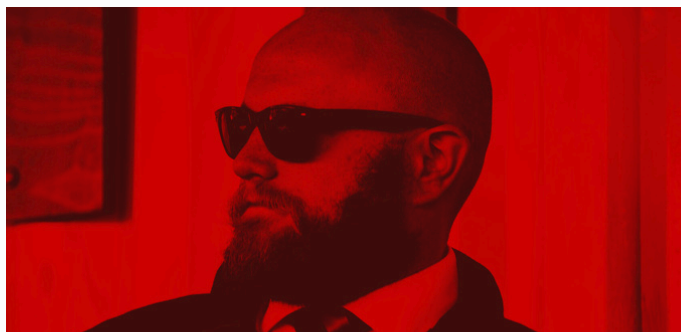
Brislington Football Club will not accept any liabilities for accidents to spectators or their property either within the ground or in its premises.

Children and spectators must not sit or stand in front of the railings surrounding the pitch at any time.

Please assist the club with this request as serious injury could occur. We must ask that spectators comply with the following regulations:

- 1.Anyone within the Stadium must comply with Club Officials instructions and shall not use foul, abusive or racist language or offensive gesture towards anyone.
- 2.No alcohol will be consumed outside of the club house, before or during a match and no glasses are to be taken outside of the Charlie Garland Bar at any point.
- 3.No person(s) shall enter onto the playing field before, during, between or after a match. The pitch surface is out-of-bounds at all times.
- 4.Only authorised personal are to enter the Changing Rooms and Hospitality suits on matchdays.

Street FC 1–0 Brislington FC

Saturday 26th July 2025 – Western League Premier Division

The waiting was over. After a summer of preparation and rebuilding, Brislington FC's new era began with a season-opening trip to Street FC.

Led by newly appointed manager Ash Kington, the Foxes fielded a new-look squad full of fresh faces and youthful energy. However, it was the hosts who settled quickest, moving the ball with confidence and asking questions of the Bris back line from the first whistle.

Their early pressure told just ten minutes in, as a well-worked corner routine was finished smartly by Harry Foster, who found the bottom corner with a precise strike that eluded defenders and left goalkeeper Jordan Schofield unsighted.



Street almost doubled their lead just four minutes later, rattling the woodwork with another sharp effort. At that point, it looked like the Bris faithful were in for a long afternoon.

But the visitors grew into the game, enjoying more of the ball and beginning to establish territory. On 27 minutes, George Jones broke free from an Anthony Essono flick-on but couldn't quite get his shot away cleanly with the goal in sight.

The second half saw a far more even contest, with Brislington competing well in all areas. The Foxes' best chance to level came in the 76th minute, when Essono connected sweetly with a volley from distance – only for the Street keeper to tip it acrobatically over the bar.

In the end, Foster's early goal proved decisive. Brislington may not have come away with any points, but there were plenty of positives for Ash Kington and his coaching staff to take from this spirited first outing. The foundations are there – now it's about building momentum.

TODAY'S OPPONENT

CLEVEDON TOWN

Clevedon Town FC are one of the oldest clubs in the West Country and were founder members of the Western League in 1892, having played friendlies and in county competitions up to that point. They only stayed in the Western League for 3 seasons before dropping into local leagues until returning for a second spell up until World War One. They played their early matches at the local cricket ground at Dial Hill before moving to a new site at Old Street (later named Teignmouth Road) in 1895, remaining there until 1992. After the Great War, they played in the Bristol & District and Bristol & Suburban Leagues before moving to the more senior Somerset Senior League in 1933, staying there until the outbreak of the Second World War. They continued to play throughout the war years, mainly in local leagues, before returning to the Western League after the war, remaining there, other than for one spell away, until they won the League title for the first time ever in 1992/93, when they were elected to the Southern League. The period after World War 2 was to be one of their best spells and they achieved some national recognition for their exploits in the FA Amateur Cup during the 1950's in particular.

For a small West Country club they enjoyed many excellent runs in that competition, playing some of the then giants of the amateur game such as Harwich and Parkeston, Pegasus and Billingham Synthonia, even enjoying a cameo appearance on the emerging television network, with notable victories being achieved against Salisbury, Briggs Sports and Ilford. It was in cup competitions that Clevedon had already gained success and they won the Somerset Senior Cup several times throughout their early history, going on to win the more senior Somerset Premier Cup as well in the 1980's and 90's.

Clevedon spent much of their history playing at junior level, during their early years and in the 1960's, or in the more senior Western League competition. However they finally achieved the next stage of their development when they won the Western League in 1992/93 and were promoted to the Southern League. The 1992/93 season also saw them move home for the first time in nearly a century when they moved to a purpose built stadium, The Hand Stadium, named after the Hand family who had been instrumental in the running of the club from the 1890's. In their first season at The Hand they went unbeaten and took their first Western League title, in front of an average gate of 421, breaking all kinds of scoring records on the way.

In their first ever season in the Southern League they finished in a very creditable fifth place under manager Steve Fey, all the more remarkable when considering that he took over the side in June with just three players remaining from the championship squad. The club settled into the Southern League and the 1998/99 season saw them win the Midlands Division and gain promotion to the Premier Division, where they remained for two seasons before suffering relegation. The club again gained promotion to the Premier Division under manager Phil Bater in 2006/07 and, in the same season, reached the 1st Round of the F A Cup for the first time in their long history, losing out to Chester City in front of a club record crowd of 2,261 at The Hand Stadium.

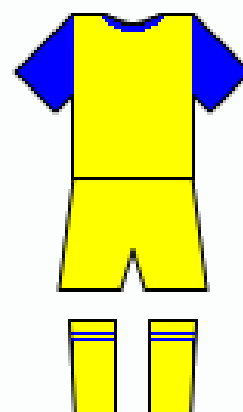
However, in common with many clubs, gates and income gradually fell and the club slipped back into Division One in 2009/10. Worse was to follow in summer 2011 when The Hand Stadium was sold outright and the club found themselves as tenants of their former home. There was however some success to cheer in 2011/12 when the club won the Red Insure Southern League Cup beating Premier Division team Banbury United 2-1 on aggregate under manager Micky Bell. Despite finishing 18th in 2014/15 Clevedon Town were demoted back to the Western League due to problems with their floodlights. In October 2015 a sponsorship deal was agreed with a personal fitness company and the Hand Stadium was renamed The Everyone Active Stadium. Clevedon rebuilt under Micky Bell and then Alex White and in 2023/24 came 4th in the Premier Division,

their highest finish since returning to The Western League. This qualified them for the play-offs where they won 1-0 in the semi-final at Bridgwater United before losing 2-0 in the final at Falmouth Town. In 2024/25 Clevedon did even better and finished 2nd in the league. But there was to be heartache in the play-offs again, despite having home advantage, when a 3-1 win over Buckland Athletic in the semi-final was followed by a 2-1 defeat against Brixham in the final with the winning goal coming in the last minute.

A week later the entire management team resigned and the club acted swiftly to appoint new managers Jamie Smith and Nic Steadman and assistant Rich Lucas, who immediately set about rebuilding the squad for the start of the 2025/26 season.

BS4'S FOOTBALL HEARTBEAT SINCE 1957

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted

to the Premier Division. After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002–03 and again in 2012–13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup. Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within. Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-from-ideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.



The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, courtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semi-final and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The re-emergence of the U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league to gain promotion losing only one game in the process. More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.

The 2024/25 season saw Matt Lewton replace John Smallwood and challenge for the league which went down to the final games, eventually missing out, however they did win the Roger Stone Memorial Cup to cap a memorable two years for the group.

The first team were to finish comfortably mid table in their first season back in the Jewson Western Premier League. Unfortunately they would lose long standing manager (and now club legend) Lee Perks who retired from his first team management duties after 10 years at the helm and 18 years at the club as a player, reserve team manager, 1st team assistant manager and ultimately 1st team number one.

Lee will be replaced By Ash Kington who will front the campaign for the upcoming season.
