Good afternoon and welcome back to the Poplar Insulation Stadium for this afternoon's Jewson Western League - Premier Division clash against Bridgwater Town. We extend a warm welcome to the players, management, officials and supporters who've made the trip from Somerset and hope you enjoy your visit to BS4.

Today marks the end of what has been a busy opening month to the season - one where we've seen the squad tested, reshaped, and slowly starting to find its feet. Last time out here at the Poplar, we faced a strong Helston Athletic side and, despite a spirited effort, fell to a disappointing 3-0 defeat. With a depleted squad and two key players unavailable, we struggled in key moments and were punished for lapses of concentration. That said, the numbers told a slightly different story: we had more possession and completed more passes, and while stats alone don't win football matches, they offered encouragement that this team isn't far away.

That belief was rewarded just over a week later, away to Nailsea & Tickenham, where we picked up our first league win of the season thanks to a determined team display and a late finish from returning defender Ben Withey. It wasn't pretty, but it was gritty – and that grit is exactly what's needed as this young squad continues to gel under Ash's leadership. The boys stood up, including several teenagers thrown into the mix late on, and the win was no less than they deserved. Let's hope it sets the tone for the weeks to come.

Across all levels of the club, there's a great deal to feel encouraged about. Our Reserves, Under-18s, and Veterans sides have all completed pre-season preparations and begin their respective campaigns shortly. The signs so far are hugely positive, with all three showing energy, identity and no shortage of talent. That momentum is credit to the work being done across the club - from coaches and volunteers to parents and players - and it speaks volumes about where we're heading as a footballing community.


LATEST MATCH REPORT

Brislington took the short trip west to fellow strugglers Nailsea & Tickenham, with both sides desperate to find a first league win of the season.

The Foxes were buoyed by several returns: Ben Withey from injury, Oaklan Buck from suspension, and manager Ash Kington naming himself in the starting XI. There was also a late twist, with forward Paulo Borges making his debut against his former club, going straight into the lineup.

At the other end of the pitch, Seb Tylek came in between the sticks for Bris, deputising for their regular shot-stopper Jordan Schofield. Bris started brightly, dominating possession and territory in the opening exchanges, though the fluency to carve out a clear chance was missing. On 14 minutes, déjà vu struck when Buck was sent to the sin bin for dissent, leaving the visitors temporarily down to ten men. Nailsea grew into the contest with the advantage, but much like Bris earlier, they couldn't turn pressure into meaningful openings.

Once back to full strength, the game settled into a scrappy affair, the first half lacking clear chances for either side. The pattern continued after the break, with the uneven pitch playing its part in a low-quality contest.



As the half wore on, Brislington began to reassert themselves. Injuries forced changes up front, with Radway and Borges replaced by teenagers Lovell and Moore. The youngsters brought fresh energy, showing impressive strength and maturity.

On 80 minutes, Moore's flick and Lovell's relentless pressing forced a Nailsea defender into conceding a corner, taking no risks by knocking the ball behind. From the resulting set-piece, Kington's clever low delivery caught the hosts off guard, and Withey was the sharpest man in the box, calmly slotting home to put Brislington in front.

The Foxes nearly scored ten minutes later when Lovell again pressed the defence into making another mistake only to see his flick roll agonisingly wide. As the game rolled into extra time it looked like Brislington had put the game to bed.

A Kington free kick was controlled by Moore who battled free to get his shot away only to see his shot parried to Lovell who was on hand to smash the ball home, unfortunately the youngster was offside.

Nailsea never mounted a meaningful fightback, and Brislington held firm to secure a priceless 1–0 victory — their first league win of the season. Kington will hope this hard-fought success provides the platform for his side to build upon in the coming weeks.





BS4'S FOOTBALL HEARTBEAT SINCE 1957

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted to the Premier Division. After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002-03 and again in 2012-13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup.

Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within. Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-fromideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.



The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semi-final and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The re-emergence of the U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league to gain promotion losing only one game in the process.

More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.

The 2024/25 season saw Matt Lewton replace John Smallwood and challenge for the league which went down to the final games, eventually missing out, however they did win the Roger Stone Memorial Cup to cap a memorable two years for the group.

The first team were to finish comfortably mid table in their first season back in the Jewson Western Premier League. Unfortunately they would lose long standing manager (and now club legend) Lee Perks who retired from his first team management duties after 10 years at the helm and 18 years at the club as a player, reserve team manager, 1st team assistant manager and ultimately 1st team number one.

Lee is replaced By Ash Kington who will front the campaign for the upcoming season.

TODAY'S OPPONENT BRIDGWATER UTD

Early attempts to establish a senior association football club in the rugby stronghold of Bridgwater failed to attract supporters, were beset with financial woes and were thus short-lived. It was not until after the Second World War that solid foundations for a club were finally laid. A group of enthusiasts formed CROWN DYNAMO FC in 1946 based at a public house in St John Street. The team quickly gained a substantial following and became the forerunner of BRIDGWATER TOWN AFC. The purchase of land off Bristol Road for a home ground [Castlefield], the backing of a large supporters' organisation and the support of prominent local businessmen, who became directors enabled the club to flourish. Soon the club owned a portfolio of residential property and was able to offer a house, a job and a good part-time wage to prospective footballers. This enabled the club to attract many ex-Football League professionals and field strong, competitive teams, which enjoyed great success as one of the Western League's leading sides. Two Western League championship mantles, cup final wins and thrilling runs in the FA Cup and FA Trophy were experienced throughout the 1960s, 70s and 80s.In 1982 Bridgwater Town AFC became members of the Southern League. However, It all came to an abrupt end in June 1984 when substantial debts forced the club into voluntary liquidation.

A new club, BRIDGWATER TOWN 1984 FC was quickly established by a band of loyal supporters: and from humble beginnings worked all the way back up from Somerset County League origins to attaining Southern League membership inside a twenty-three year timespan. On the way the club enjoyed a hat-trick of Somerset County League titles, a Screwfix Western League Division 1 championship and two Les Philips Cup Final wins. As members of the Southern League they reached the Final of the League Cup (2009) and were beaten finalists in the promotion play-offs (2010) However after 2010 leaner times returned, eventually leading to relegation in 2017. Returning to Step 5 level once more, the club remains ambitious, with the aim of competing strongly for the title and regaining its previous status. The club's ambitions received a massive boost during the early part of 2021 as it merged with Yeovil United FC to become BRIDGWATER UNITED FC. Now, with a new club status, ownership and business model, plans are at an advanced stage to make the club a real community asset - not just for the town of Bridgwater but for the whole of Somerset. 2021/22 was a success clinching the Les Phillips Cup with a 1-0 victory over Cadbury Heath at Wells City FC along with a number of other cup wins for the Women's squad and youth teams. Last season tailed off after a fantastic start, reaching the FA Vase Fifth round was the highlight but in front of a decent attendance and with a number of players missing United succumbed to a 1-0 defeat against the eventual winners Ascot United. In the Toolstation Western League the team finished fourth, Mousehole winning the league with Saltash United runners-up and Barnstaple Town 3rd, 6 points above the Robins. Soon after the season finished Adam Murry sold the club to IT entrepreneur Ian Davis who has many exciting plans to take the club forward, in his first season he dismissed manager Dave Pearse replacing him with Bristol City legend Andy Llewellyn. The team finished in a play-off spot but lost at home to Clevedon Town, the third 1-0 defeat against them. Last season was a disappointment for everyone associated with Bridgwater, the Robins finished in the bottom four despite being in the top two in August. Four managers came and went as the side struggled for goals, fifty players wearing the first team shirt. In June Davis appointed former Bristol Manor Farm manager Lee Lashenko to stabilise the club on and off the pitch.

Louis Smith: Young keeper who started at Bristol Manor Farm and then played for Keynsham Town, spent last season at Corsham Town. One of Lashenko's first signings.

B**en John:** Goalkeeping coach who has joined Lee Lashenko from Bristol Manor Farm. Ben has played more than 750 games in his career including the likes of Larkhall, Paulton Rovers, Chippenham Town, Almondsbury and Cinderford Town. Has also previously played for Bridgwater Town.

Mark Armstrong: Captain of the club and a born leader, Mark is an experienced, hardworking, tough tackling midfielder, equally comfortable in central defence, made well over 200 appearances for the Robins so far.

Harry Horton: Powerful 26 year-old midfielder, missed almost the last eighteen months with an ACL injury but returned at the end of last season. A long serving member of the squad, signing from Wells City where he played 37 games scoring 12 times. He has played for Yate Town amongst others.

Finn Hodge: Versatile young defender who came through BMF under 18's to break into the first team last season. The Robins beat off competition from Southern League sides to sign the youngster who came through Bristol City's Foundation side and also played first team football for Mendip Broadwalk.

Haydan Chambers: Young wide player picked up from local football, great turn of pace, has already found the net four times this season.

Jake Liewellyn: Left back approaching 300 games for Bridgwater, returned from Exmouth Town last season and now firmly established in the side. Formerly with Weston-super-Mare.

Jude McCarthy: 20-year-old right back signed from Brislington where he had made 122 appearances. Previously with Hengrove Athletic where he played over 80 games.

Lloyd Mills: Former Bristol Manor Farm centre-back who spent 11 years with the Portwaymen before departing for Roman Glass St George. Has also played for Nailsea & Tickenham and Bishop Sutton.

Josh Ford: Tough tackling centre-back who has joined from Paulton Rovers for whom he has had three spells. Has also played for Frome Town, Melksham Town, Bristol Manor Farm and Willand Rovers.

Joe Teall: Central midfielder signed from Clevedon Town who had signed him from Clevedon United. Played 39 times for the Seasiders in 2023/24 scoring 5 times and 41 times last season netting 7 goals.

Regan Lashenko: Highly rated young midfielder who followed his father from BMF. The 19 year old started five games in the Southern League last season, he has also played for Bishop Sutton.

George King: Re-signed from Clevedon Town where he made 43 appearances last season scoring 3 times. Joined The Seasiders from Bridgwater last summer after a highly successful season at Fairfax Park. Has also played for BMF, Weston-super-Mare, Yate Town and Larkhall Athletic.

Billy Tucker: Goalscoring midfielder who has joined from Bideford (where he has played over 200 games) and also played for Helston Athletic and Okehampton Argyle last season. 25 games and 5 goals in the Southern League and 2 goals in 10 for Okehampton. Now 30 he has also played for Barnstaple Town and Ilfracombe Town.

Will Hughes: - Defender Hughes can play across the entire back four, primarily from the right-hand side. Far from no nonsense despite his young age, the defender is incredibly calm under pressure. Previous clubs include Bristol Manor Farm, Cribbs and Andover.

Sam Beresford: Striker and the third Seasider to join from Clevedon Town. Scored 45 goals in the last two seasons in the Western League. Joined Clevedon from Uphill Castle for whom he netted 146 goals in 239 games.

Dan Dodimead: Ex-BMF striker who turned down Southern League offers to follow Laz to Bridgwater, scored 9 in 45 games last season and 9 in 24 the previous season. Has also played for Larkhall Athletic and Hengrove.

Freddie King: 21 year old forward Freddie is on loan from Weston-super-Mare who he joined in the Summer from Clevedon Town, where he made over 100 appearances and scored 34 goals for the Seasiders in the 24/25 season.

Owen Howe: joined from BMF, prolific centre-forward who achieved legendary status at Tiverton Town making his debut as a 16 year old. Still Tiverton's youngest ever scorer netting against Exeter City in the Devon Cup in 2011. Went on to score 78 goals in 175 games. Has also played for Bideford, Salisbury City (two spells) BMF (three spells) Weston- super-Mare, Taunton Town, Barnstaple Town and Willand Rovers. Scored 8 in 24 games last season.
