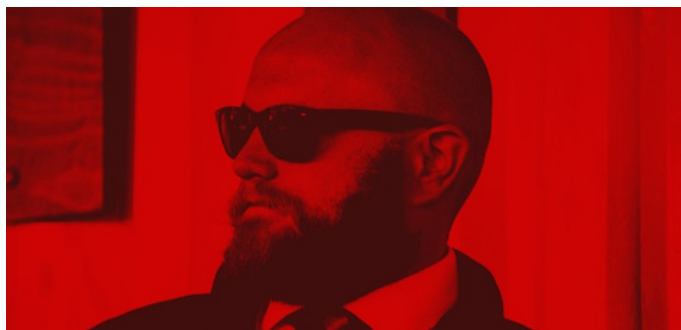
CLUB STATEMENT

Children and spectators must not sit or stand in front of the railings surrounding the pitch at any time.**

Please assist the club with this request as serious injury could occur. We must ask that spectators comply with the following regulations:

- 1.Anyone within the Stadium must comply with Club Officials instructions and shall not use foul, abusive or racist language or offensive gesture towards anyone.
- 2.No alcohol will be consumed outside of the club house, before or during a match and no glasses are to be taken outside of the Charlie Garland Bar at any point.
- 3.No person(s) shall enter onto the playing field before, during, between or after a match. The pitch surface is out-of-bounds at all times.
- 4.Only authorised personal are to enter the Changing Rooms and Hospitality suits on matchdays.

Today we welcome Sidmouth — a new side to the league and something of an unknown quantity. That brings its own challenges, but also an opportunity to start building some momentum.

Midfield/Defence: Ben is an experienced player who's played at Southern league level, technically good and extremely versatile player who looks equally comfortable in pretty much every position!

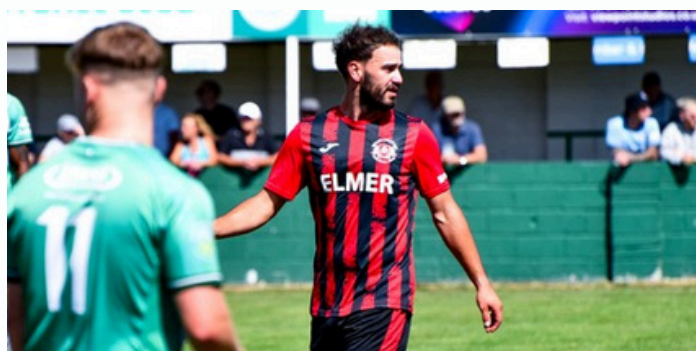


LEWIS DUNN

**CALUM EVANS**

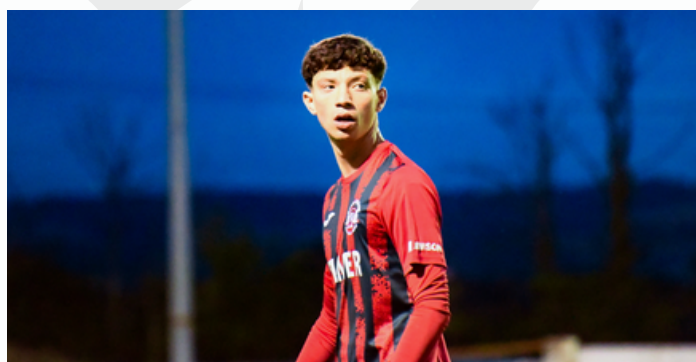

LATEST MATCH REPORT



A break from league action saw the Foxes make the long trip east to Wokingham for an FA Cup Extra Preliminary Round clash. The hosts were in buoyant mood, with a packed ground helping to mark their 150th anniversary celebrations.

It was a nightmare start for Brislington, conceding just four minutes in. Ty Moorcroft capitalised on some early hesitancy at the back to slot home and give the Sumas the lead. Wokingham looked to press home their advantage, creating further opportunities in the final third.

Bris, however, began to grow into the game. On 19 minutes, the equaliser came: Jayden Radway battled well to win possession on the edge of the box, and Jay Malpas pounced on the loose ball, unleashing a thunderous strike that gave the keeper no chance.

The contest was finely poised, with both sides trading attacking spells. But it was the home side who restored their advantage on 32 minutes—Moorcroft again, this time finishing off a swift break down the right.

Trailing 2–1 at the break, Brislington came out strongly in the second half, enjoying good spells of possession despite tricky pitch conditions. Their persistence was rewarded on the hour mark: a delicious Elliott Saunders delivery from a set piece found Oaklan Buck, whose glancing header squeezed in to make it 2–2.

Brislington thought they had taken the lead on 75 minutes when Jayden Radway tucked one away, only for the flag to go up for offside—a marginal call that denied what would have been a crucial goal.

As the game edged towards a replay, both sides carved out late chances. But in the 90th minute, heartbreak struck—Sean Moore fired low past Schofield at the near post to win it for the home side.

Brislington weren't done, pushing for a dramatic third equaliser. Debutant Amari McLeary impressed with some sharp dribbling, nearly orchestrating a late twist, but it wasn't to be.

The Foxes bow out of the Cup after a valiant effort. Wokingham were outstanding hosts and we wish them the very best in the next round.

For Brislington, while this marks a third consecutive defeat, there were plenty of positives: strong individual performances and growing signs of chemistry in this newly rebuilt squad suggest brighter days lie ahead.

BS4'S FOOTBALL HEARTBEAT SINCE 1957

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted

to the Premier Division. After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002–03 and again in 2012–13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup. Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within. Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-from-ideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.



The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semi-final and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The re-emergence of the U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league to gain promotion losing only one game in the process. More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.

The 2024/25 season saw Matt Lewton replace John Smallwood and challenge for the league which went down to the final games, eventually missing out, however they did win the Roger Stone Memorial Cup to cap a memorable two years for the group.

The first team were to finish comfortably mid table in their first season back in the Jewson Western Premier League. Unfortunately they would lose long standing manager (and now club legend) Lee Perks who retired from his first team management duties after 10 years at the helm and 18 years at the club as a player, reserve team manager, 1st team assistant manager and ultimately 1st team number one.

Lee will be replaced By Ash Kington who will front the campaign for the upcoming season.

TODAY'S OPPONENT

SIDMOUTH TOWN

Sidmouth Town were members of the Exeter and District League for many decades, finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1959–60, and winning it in 1967–68. They won the renamed Devon and Exeter League Premier Division in 2010–11, having finished as runners-up the previous season.[2] They were subsequently promoted to the South West Peninsula League Division One East.[3] At the end of 2018–19 the league was restructured, and Sidmouth successfully applied for promotion to the Premier Division East, at Step 6 of the National League System.

The club competed in the FA Vase for the first time in 2018–19. They won their first qualifying-round match 3–2 against Keynsham Town and followed that up with a second win, 4–1 against Godolphin Atlantic. Following these two matches, both against sides one level higher in the pyramid, they lost 5–0 in the first-round proper to Cadbury Heath, from two levels above them.

The 2024–25 season saw Sidmouth Town promoted to step five for the first time in the club's history, crowned champions of the South West Peninsula Premier Division East.
