Please assist the club with this request as serious injury could occur. We must ask that spectators comply with the following regulations:

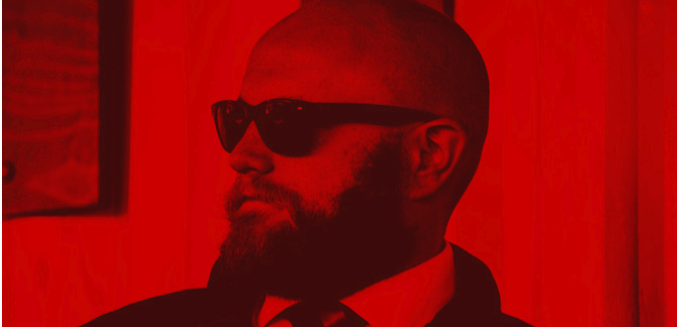
1.Anyone within the Stadium must comply with Club Officials instructions and shall not use foul, abusive or racist language or offensive gesture towards anyone.

FROM THE BENCH

Good afternoon.

Firstly I'd like to welcome Helston to the Poplar insulation stadium for today's fixture, we wish them a safe journey to and from the ground.

Last Saturday's draw was hard fought with ten men for a large portion of the game but it was that effort that we're going to need if we're going to turn things around.

As a management team we are working tirelessly to bring in three or four new faces to support the squad we already have (which is not easy and won't be instant).

I firmly believe that once we add that extra bit of quality, the results will start turning in our favour. We're doing a lot of good things on the pitch, but we're just missing that final bit of cutting edge.



One of the great things about football is the quick turnaround—you always get another chance to put things right. Today, we welcome Helston after their long journey, and our focus is firmly on getting that first win of the season under our belt.

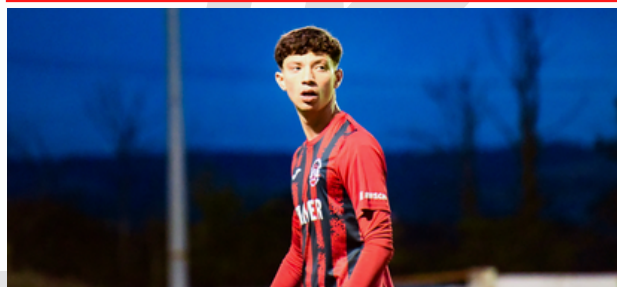
CALUM EVANS

LATEST MATCH REPORT

On a sweltering Tuesday night under the lights, Brislington's first away weeknight league fixture of the season ended in disappointment as they fell to their third league defeat of the campaign. The foxes had travelled to Trowbridge Road aiming to build on the point gained at the weekend, and hoping to catch Bradford Town still smarting from their late loss to Newquay AFC. But the Bobcats, promoted back to the Premier Division after last term's play-off success, proved a stern test and ultimately ran out 4–1 winners.

The opening exchanges were evenly matched, with little to separate the sides. But on the half-hour mark, the game swung decisively in Bradford's favour. Player-manager Ash Kington, jumping to defend a cross, was adjudged to have handled the ball inside the box. Referee Michael Halford pointed to the spot, and Jack Farion made no mistake – calmly converting to put the hosts ahead.

The Bobcats took full advantage of the momentum shift. Just six minutes later, a speculative shot that the Brislington keeper would probably have expected to hold on to instead squeezed loose and out for a corner. From the resulting delivery, Brislington failed to clear their lines, and in-form youngster Jensen Wakefield – fresh from his FA Cup hat-trick – pounced to double the lead.

Ollie Williams was one of the brighter sparks for Brislington in the first half, showing real quality on the ball and involving himself in many of the visitors' attacking moves. His composure and vision offered a glimmer of creativity on an otherwise difficult night for the away side, and his performance earned him the Brislington Man of the Match award.

With the game threatening to slip away, Brislington focused on reaching half-time without further damage. Goalkeeper Jordan Schofield was called into action one last time before the break, tipping a stinging direct free-kick to safety.

The second half saw a spirited response from the visitors. Whatever was said in the dressing room clearly had an effect, as Brislington became a real handful and began to turn the screw. Just four minutes after the restart, left-back Alfie Clarke launched a superb long ball that striker Oaklan Buck tracked perfectly before slotting home to make it 2–1.

The goal sparked a period of Brislington pressure, and they thought they had found a route back into the game five minutes later when a dangerous attack was halted by what appeared to be a Bradford handball. Post-match video replays confirmed it was indeed a clear infringement, meaning Brislington were right to be incensed at the lack of an award. With the visitors firmly on top at that moment, the decision proved a pivotal one, thwarting their momentum and a genuine route back into the game.

It was a bitter pill to swallow, made worse minutes later when Bradford struck again through Leo Gallazi. From the stands it looked offside, but post-match video confirmed he had timed his run perfectly to beat the trap.

Bradford saved the best for last. Harvey Woods capped the night with a spectacular strike from 35 yards, an effort no goalkeeper could have stopped, sealing a 4–1 victory for the home side.

To Brislington's credit, they mustered on. Midfielder Radway in particular epitomised the industry and work rate demanded on such a challenging evening. There was also cause for optimism in the way the team's younger players stepped up. In the closing stages, Brislington fielded a side with an average age of just 21 – including five teenagers – and, to their credit, they kept Bradford at bay for the remainder of the match.

Brislington will need to put this painful result behind them as they prepare for a swift return to action – hosting Helston in just a few days' time.

The club was established in 1956 as an under-16 team, and initially played in the Bristol Church of England League, winning the Somerset Intermediate Cup in 1961–62 and 1962–63, and the Somerset Junior Cup in 1963–64. By 1965 the club were playing in the Senior Division of the Bristol & Suburban League.

During the 1970s we moved up to the Somerset County League, winning the League Cup in 1976–77, and finishing as runners-up in the Premier Division in 1979–80, 1983–84 and 1984–85.

The club went on to win the Premier Division and the Somerset Senior Cup in 1988–89, and after finishing as runners-up and winning the Senior Cup in 1990–91, they were promoted to Division One of the Western League.

Brislington won the Somerset Senior Cup again in 1992–93, and after a third-place finish in Division One in 1993–94, they won both Division One and the Senior Cup the following season and were promoted

to the Premier Division. After winning the Somerset Premier Cup in 1995–96, the club were Premier Division runners-up in 2002–03 and again in 2012–13.

Due to the escalating travel costs of the Toolstation Western League Premier Division, which forced Odd Down to take voluntary relegation, and with a sideways move to the Hellenic Premier ruled out, the club decided to follow Odd Down's lead and take the step down to the Toolstation Western League Division one.

This proved to be a decisive move as the 2022/23 Season saw the Foxes win the league, scoring 130 goals in the process, and reach the Semi Final of the Les Phillips Cup.

Brislington were unable to return to the Premier Division, although this was a blessing in disguise as that season saw the demise of Ashton & Backwell as a Western league club and Bitton, who failed to fulfil their fixtures, pulling out midway through the season, both falling foul of the increased running costs.

The 2023/24 Season saw the reintroduction of an U18s side as the club look to rebuild a pathway to adult football from within. Unfortunately the season was plagued by poor weather, far too many games were cancelled due to persistent rain, leaving all three teams a far-from-ideal heavily-backloaded schedule. Despite that however, all three teams were to gain a level of success on the pitch.



The first team were promoted back to the Premier Division albeit via the play-offs, after finishing a very disappointing seventh in the table (despite finishing the league's leading goalscorers). However they redeemed themselves by beating Radstock Town away in the semi-final then Wincanton Town away 2-3, where a dramatic second-half comeback saw a two-goal first-half deficit overturned with the winner coming in the 93rd minute, curtesy of Lewis Dunn!!

They also reached the Final of the Somerset Senior Cup although that game wasn't played due to the backlog of league fixtures, both the semi-final and final were due to be played before July 31st 2024!

The reserve team made it to their cup Final. Unfortunately they would lose to opponents Haywood Village, missing out on penalties after the game couldn't be settled in 90 minutes.

The re-emergence of the U18s, lead by John Smallwood, Phil Wiltshire & John Lovell were a revelation, winning their league to gain promotion losing only one game in the process.

More importantly from a club perspective, 10 young players were to feature for the first team, unsurprisingly none looking out of place, with a few excelling, proving the decision to reintroduce an 18s set-up was a very good one.

The 2024/25 season saw Matt Lewton replace John Smallwood and challenge for the league which went down to the final games, eventually missing out, however they did win the Roger Stone Memorial Cup to cap a memorable two years for the group.

The first team were to finish comfortably mid table in their first season back in the Jewson Western Premier League. Unfortunately they would lose long standing manager (and now club legend) Lee Perks who retired from his first team management duties after 10 years at the helm and 18 years at the club as a player, reserve team manager, 1st team assistant manager and ultimately 1st team number one.

Lee is replaced By Ash Kington who will front the campaign for the upcoming season.

In 2023 Helston Athletic achieved a Cornwall Senior Cup and Western League Les Phillips Cup double before securing promotion, as league champions, to The Pitching In Southern League Division 1 West in 2024. The club was subsequently relegated back to the Western League after just a single season

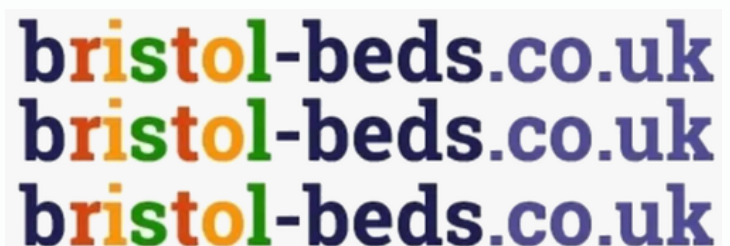
